<p>School Days</p> <p>This project teaches children about their own school and locality, both today and in the past. We study how school has changed for the people of Walsall Wood. They compare schooling in the Victorian era to their experiences today through a visit to the Black Country Living Museum.</p>	<p>Bright Lights, Big City</p> <p>In this project children have the opportunity to look at a historical significant event (Great Fire of London) in detail and compare aspects of life from different periods of time. Children will complete an enquiry into how life now has changed as a result of the fire.</p>	<p>Magnificent Monarchs</p> <p>This project teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and then research six of the most significant sovereigns.</p>

<p>Childhood</p> <p>This project teaches children about everyday life and families today, including comparisons with childhood in the 1950s, using artefacts and a range of different sources.</p>	<p>Movers and Shakers</p> <p>This project teaches children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance.</p>	<p>Coastline</p> <p>This project investigates jobs in the past. Significant people – captain Cook. We challenge stereotypes when we find out about the bravery of Grace Darling.</p>

<p>Ancient Civilisations</p> <p>This project teaches children about the history of three of the world's first ancient civilisations: ancient Sumer, ancient Egypt and the Indus Valley civilisation. Children will learn about the rise, life, achievements and eventual end of each civilisation.</p>	<p>Misty Mountains</p>	<p>Through the Ages</p> <p>This project teaches children about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including changes to people and lifestyle caused by ingenuity, invention and technological advancement.</p>

Visit to Stourport Basin</p>	<p>Invasion</p> <p>This project teaches children about life in Britain after the Roman withdrawal. Children will learn about Anglo-Saxon and Viking invasions up to the Norman conquest.</p>

Johnson, Dorothy Vaughan and Mary Jackson played.</p>	<p>Ground Breaking Greeks This project teaches children about developments and changes over six periods of ancient Greek history, focusing on the city state of Athens in the Classical age, and exploring the lasting legacy of ancient Greece.</p>	<p>Sow, Grow and Farm This project teaches children about the dig for victory campaign during WW2.</p>

<p>Maafa This project teaches children about Africa past and present including Ancient Benin society. Children discover the development of the slave trade. It also explores Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade, the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa and the worldwide communities that make up the African diaspora.</p>	<p>Frozen Kingdom This project teaches children about polar exploration; Significant people – Robert Falcon Scott; Ernest Shackleton. Significant events - Titanic.
