At St John's we aim to spend sports premium in the following ways in 2021/22 Academic Year in order to:

- 1) Give staff an opportunity to work alongside PE specialists to improve quality of PE lessons raise fitness levels
- 2) Develop a lunchtime physical activity offer for all age groups in order to increase participations in physical activities across lunch times
- 3) Increase participation across the school in physical learning opportunities in order to develop healthy lifestyles in our pupils.

Lunchtime Sports Clubs	£2,535	Increased participation in physical learning opportunities all year groups at lunchtimes twice a week This then established by play leaders 2 times a week on days sports coaches not working
Improved resources for children to use at lunchtimes so that they can engage in physical learning opportunities	£600	Increased participation in physical learning opportunities all year groups at lunchtimes daily
Sports TA to work alongside staff in morning PE sessions in order to improve quality of PE provisions	£4,563	Increased subject knowledge of teachers in delivering PE across school. Particular focus on ECT subject knowledge.
PE lead to create a network of support in order to increase inter and intra school sports competition opportunities	£3,042	Children of all abilities and backgrounds have the opportunity to compete
Dance sessions across the school year (term for KS 1, Term for lower KS 2 and term for Upper KS2) led by dance specialist teacher providing additional sports lessons across the school year exceeding minimum 2 hours per week	£2,000	Increased participation of all KS 1 and 2 pupils in PE learning opportunities. So they exceed the minimum of 2 hours PE a week by 45 mins each pupil
Contribution towards swimming costs so that all year 3-6 pupils can swim across the school year	£3,000	Increased participation of all pupils in PE learning opportunities. Supports water confidence and safety in and around water, improves individual's strength and flexibility and increases stamina.
Development of outdoor area on the school grounds to enable all children to access the outdoors and engage in a range of learning opportunities provided by the environment. Including Forest School training for one member of staff.	£14,527	Increased activity in the outdoors to support the development of all children's physical health and well-being.
Support from Streetly Academy to offer inter house sports for all pupils	£1,350	Increased opportunities pupils to participate in sports competition across school.
