## Heart of England In Bloom.

At the end of last year, a parent approached us asking if we were interested in the 'Heart of England In Bloom' award. This initiative will be going live for 2014 in a few weeks, so we have decided to become involved. This is a whole school initiative that will involve all pupils and any parents that wish to take part.

This is a copy of the mark sheet, showing the areas that they will be investigating; -

#### **Quality of School Grounds**

A welcoming entrance with the overall appearance of the grounds demonstrating respect by staff, parents and pupils.

#### Flowers/ Vegetables/ Fruit



The involvement of pupils (with support from teaching staff / parents / volunteers) in the growing of a range of edible and ornamental plants to include propagation, planting, maintenance and harvesting (edibles) will be taken into account as will the number of pupils involved whether in school clubs or class.

#### **Sustainability**

Where there is little or no scope for the provision of natural areas in the school grounds then involvement of pupils in an off-site local habitat resource will gain marks

Innovative ideas having impact on pupils understanding of environmental issues in the school grounds will gain marks

### **Use of Grounds for School Curriculum**

Examples of pupil's work clearly showing the educational uses of the grounds will be sought.

We are already well on the way to achieving many of the standards, but would really like to make the school even more inviting, including aspects such as recycling and sustainability. The adventure playground has recently been overhauled, with rotten timbers replaced and wood treatments applied for preservation. The reception outdoor learning environment has been tidied up and we have had a team of litter pickers removing all the litter that has blown in over



the summer holidays. We have ordered some new bins, one of which will be placed at the front of school and a working group has been set up so in the near future, years 1 to 5 can be involved in an eco club on a Monday evening! We are also asking for any donations of bulbs so that each child in the school can plant their own ready for the Spring. We are also hoping to make some specific

wildlife areas, and are seeking any parents with carpentry skills so that we can make bird boxes!
